The Leeds Arts Council is proud to announce that **Disney's *Frozen JR.*** is the show chosen for the Summer Student Theater Workshop for students in grades 2-12. The workshop will be held June 3-15 at the Leeds Theatre and Arts Center, in downtown Leeds. The workshop is a two-week workshop, with students attending 8 am to 12 noon, Monday through Friday. There will be **three performances**: Friday June 14 at 7 pm, Saturday June 15 at 2 pm and 7 pm. The director is Michael Bridges, award-winning drama director at Our Lady of the Valley Catholic School.

Based on the 2018 Broadway musical, ***Frozen JR.*** brings Elsa, Anna, and the magical land of Arendelle to life, onstage. The show features all of the memorable songs from the animated film with music and lyrics by Kristen Anderson-Lopez and Robert Lopez, plus five new songs written for the Broadway production. A story of true love and acceptance between sisters, ***Frozen JR.*** expands upon the emotional relationship and journey between Princesses Anna and Elsa. When faced with danger, the two discover their hidden potential and the powerful bond of sisterhood. With a cast of beloved characters and loaded with magic, adventure, and plenty of humor, ***Frozen JR.*** is sure to thaw even the coldest heart! We hope your student will join us this summer for these two weeks of theater fun!

The cost of the workshop is \$225 per child. If more than one child from a family attends, the cost of any additional child will be \$200. Each child who attends the workshop will have a part in the play and will appear on stage. Tickets to the Friday and Saturday performances will be open to family and friends of students for \$5 each.

Registration must be received in person or by mail by 12 noon on Friday May 24. Checks are to be made out to Leeds Arts Council and returned with the registration. The maximum number of participants will be 40; if this number of registrations is reached before May 24, registration will be cut off at that point. Please complete the registration form and return it as soon as possible. We are looking forward to a great workshop!

LEEDS THEATRE WORKSHOP POLICIES

Behavior is managed to ensure the safety and enjoyment for all involved. Children are expected to behave appropriately at all times. If it seems that the child's behavior cannot be controlled by the teacher/director, the parent or guardian may be called to pick up the child. The Leeds Arts Council, Inc. reserves the right to dismiss a participant for any behavior that may be inappropriate for the workshop. The workshop staff is unable to provide one-on-one behavior management.

Medications cannot be given by any Leeds Arts Council, Inc. employee or volunteer. Participants must be able to take medications without assistance.

If your child becomes sick during the workshop, the staff will call the parent or guardian, then the emergency number.

If your child has special needs, please indicate this on the registration form. We will do our very best to accommodate them.

Can Parents or Guardians Stay? Children usually feel inhibited around their parents or guardians when they are performing. It is sometimes best for the child if the parent or guardian leaves them. We have several adults on hand to assist the children in every way. However, if you feel the need to stay, we can accommodate you in the lobby.

Please make sure that your child wears comfortable clothing during the workshop, as they will be moving and dancing. They will need comfortable shoes with closed toes and heels. They may bring their dance shoes. The girls should not wear skirts or short shorts. All blouses and shirts should have sleeves.

Each child must bring enough food for snacks every day. There is a refrigerator available for storage, but please label everything with your child's name as food can get mixed up in the shuffle. The children will be working up a healthy appetite and will need plenty to eat and drink. On the final Friday of the workshop, the LAC Board will provide pizza for lunch.

No food or drink is allowed in the theater at any time. Lunch and snacks will take place in the lobby area.

Keep It Clean! We are very proud of our Arts Center. We must all work together to keep it clean and tidy so it can be used for many years to come. We do not have staff to clean up so please put all trash in the proper containers. We must make sure the backstage areas, dressing rooms, and bathrooms are kept clean.

Supervision and Safety: At no time is a child left unsupervised. The workshop is organized in such a way that the teacher/student ratio is kept to a level to ensure safety. Also, we are located on a busy street and no child will be permitted to exit the building for any reason except to be picked up at the end of the session. No child may enter the prop room or dressing rooms unless supervised.

Costumes: Most costumes for this year's production will be supplied. You will probably have to provide foundation garments like shorts, shirts, leggings, shoes, etc. Director will advise the parents or guardians on what to get for their parts.

Performances: For performances, please make sure you arrive at the theatre one hour early with your child. The Director will give you more information. Tickets to the Friday and Saturday shows will be available to students' family and friends for \$5.

There will be a photo session following the Saturday afternoon performance.

Strike the Set and Clean-Up: We ask that parents or guardians stay for about thirty minutes after the last performance to help strike the set. The Director will assign specific jobs. Clean-up is essential between performances also.

No cell phone calls or texting will be allowed during the workshop time. If a problem develops, a cell phone may be held by the director until the end of the day. A telephone is available in the office in case of emergencies.
